Letter from the Leader of the Council

Dear Residents,

Welcome to the spring edition of our Spelthorne Bulletin. As I have mentioned from the outset, my main priority as Leader is to make sure we are in a strong financial position so that we can protect the services we are elected to provide. Through prudent investments we have succeeded in closing the £3.2m budget gap ahead of schedule.

This doesn't mean the Council is flush with cash. It means that we have borrowed at a low fixed rate to make sound investments which give us valuable assets for the future and generate substantial income to spend on maintaining services and avoiding cuts. We are not resting on our laurels. We foresee further budget pressures in the next 3-4 years of about £1.8m and are acting now to prepare.

I understand that the difference between the County and Borough areas of responsibility can be confusing to residents. Criticism for some of the tough and unpopular decisions that Surrey County Council has had to take have sometimes been unfairly laid at Spelthorne's door. There is a list of the two councils' responsibilities on page 15.

We are here to represent the people who elected us and to that end will do all we can to influence the County in matters of local concern. For example, we knew that a proposed plan to close Staines Fire Station was hugely worrying for residents and lobbied the key people in Surrey for them to honour their promise to keep the fire station open until the new facility in Fordbridge was up and running.

As long-standing supporters of Heathrow, we are pleased that expansion plans have moved a step forward with the Department of Transport announcing a consultation, including local events, encouraging people to have their say. Please see page 15 for more on this.

I recently reiterated my strong opposition to propos our determination to protect the Green Belt for future generations. At the end of 2015 we announced our 'windfall grants' and invited community groups to bid for a share of the £260K being made available. The applications are currently being looked at and we will announce how the money will be allocated in the summer edition of the Bulletin.

Rest assured, my team and I will continue to work tirelessly to promote the best interests of all Spelthorne residents and businesses.

New homes for Spelthorne

Spelthorne Council is currently progressing a number of plans designed to help increase the availability of much needed housing in the Borough and recently purchased the site of the former Bugle Pub in Upper Halliford to build up to ten new flats. The Green Belt land to the rear of the site will be retained and enhanced as a natural habitat.

A planning application was also submitted at the end of last year to develop three two-bedroom homes with car parking on the site of Churchill Hall in Churchill Way, Sunbury-on-Thames. The application has now been approved and work is planned to start on site late summer.

Harper Hotel in Fordbridge Road, Ashford, was bought by the Council last spring and plans are being developed to replace the current building with new accommodation designed specifically for local homeless families. This will reduce the need to place families in bed and breakfast accommodation, which is very expensive for the Council Tax payers.

In addition to residential properties, the Council has also been acquiring business assets which provide a substantial long-term income which can be reinvested in services for residents. Following the purchase of the BP site in Sunbury-on-Thames reported in the last edition of the Bulletin, the Council recently bought Elmbrook House, in Sunbury-on-Thames, for just over £7m. Situated next to Sunbury railway station, the newly refurbished property is occupied by insurance provider, Complete Cover Group, who have a long-term lease.

The future of Kempton Park

In January the Jockey Club and Redrow Homes jointly proposed the closure of Kempton Park Racecourse and building of 3000 homes. The Leader of Spelthorne Council, Cllr Ian Harvey, responded swiftly by writing an open letter

reassuring residents that he and the Council are strongly opposed to development of the Green Belt.

Cllr Harvey said: “Many will recall my open letter to Redrow Homes last April, where I made my opposition, on behalf of the residents of Sunbury and Spelthorne, very clear and the proposal then was for 1500 houses. Nothing has changed except my resolve which has doubled. I cannot understand why the Jockey Club and Redrow continue pushing this hopeless cause.

The reality is that every local planning authority has a statutory duty to maintain an up-to-date ‘Local Plan’ that needs to balance many competing demands including protecting areas of importance. As Spelthorne’s is due for a review we are required to ask land owners to submit details of any sites they wish us to consider for future development. This is what has happened and is called a ‘Call for Sites’.

It will be for the Council, through its new Local Plan, to decide how much development is needed in the future and the most sustainable locations for it to go. It is not bound by any particular proposals that are put forward by developers. The Council expects its Local Plan to be adopted in 2020. I am fully aware of the views of local residents and have consistently made clear my strong opposition to development of this site and my determination to protect the Green Belt in Spelthorne. The Council’s finances are very robust and any suggestion that it needs money from new development is completely groundless.”

Heathrow consultation

In October 2016, the Government announced its support for a new northwest runway at Heathrow and has now launched a 16 week public consultation on a draft National Policy Statement (NPS) which closes on 25 May.

A NPS sets out the policy that applies to decisions on whether major infrastructure projects can go ahead. The consultation is your opportunity to have your say. More information and the consultation feedback form is available at www.gov.uk/dft/heathrow-airport-expansion

To be eligible for Team Spelthorne you must either live or go to school in Spelthorne and if you already play a sport, you must be below county standard.

Focus on food waste

Why do we collect food waste separately?

Good for you:

- weekly collections (rather than food being in your rubbish bin for two weeks)
- easier to keep your caddy clean than a larger rubbish bin (it can go in the dishwasher!)
- waste food is mainly kept outside (reducing smells indoors)
- you can use plastic bags to line your food waste caddy – easier, cheaper, cleaner
- you can see how much food and money you are wasting
- it saves money for you and your council because composting is the cheapest way to dispose of food waste

Good for the environment:

- it is an environmentally friendly way to process waste food
- it is recycled to produce fertiliser; not buried or burnt
- it generates renewable energy

How do I use the food waste service?

- keep the small grey caddy in your kitchen (use a different container or keep the caddy in a cupboard if you do not like the look of it)
- line it with plastic bags (or compostable liners/newspaper if you prefer)
- use for any food waste e.g. fruit/vegetable peelings, teabags, egg shells, bones

- when it is full, tie the bag and put it in your large green caddy which is kept outside
- make sure you keep your outside caddy locked by putting the handle down at the front of the bin
- put your large green caddy next to your wheelie bin by 6am on your normal recycling/rubbish collection day

Where can I get liners from?

- use any plastic bag e.g. small pedal bin liners (you can buy these in rolls of 50 or 100 from supermarkets or hardware stores) or reuse carrier bags
- always remove your food from all packaging/plastic film – only the liners can be removed prior to the composting process

How do I get caddies if I don't already have them?

You can collect indoor and outdoor caddies from the Council Offices, Staines Community Centre, Fordbridge Community Centre, Greeno Community Centre or Benwell Community Centre.

Businesses back the BID

Businesses in Staines-upon-Thames have given a clear endorsement for the introduction of a Business Improvement District (BID) that will generate over £1.5m over 5 years to be invested in town centre projects.

Local businesses took part in a ballot in December and over 76% of votes cast supported the introduction of a BID. The turnout was 45% which is slightly above the national average for towns that have held BID ballots.

The £1.5m will be generated by businesses within the BID area contributing a levy between 0.75% and 1.5% of their rateable value and will be used for initiatives which increase visitor numbers.

Cllr Colin Barnard, Cabinet Member for Planning and Economic Development, said: "Spelthorne Borough Council backed the Staines BID from the start with a contribution of £50k in the first 18 months. The BID will surely improve the competitiveness of the town against neighbouring shopping destinations and raise its profile as a great place to shop, work and live. Staines-upon-Thames continues to punch above its weight and it's great to see businesses are confident about investing in the future of the town."

Better Neighbourhood Grants

Dozens of good causes and community initiatives benefit every year from nearly £40,000 donated by Spelthorne councillors to improve their neighbourhoods. In the past year, grants have been made in support of school and sports club facilities; help for vulnerable older people; towards running a winter shelter for homeless people and environmental improvements such as tree-planting and floral baskets.

One of the most generous contributions was a joint donation organised by Cllr Maureen Attewell, Cabinet Member for Community Wellbeing, to bring Christmas seasonal cheer to the Borough's Meals on Wheels recipients. She gathered donations totalling more than £2,000 from fellow councillors, to buy Christmas gifts and treats for those who use the service all year round.

She said: "At a time when funding for older people's services is increasingly under threat, we wanted to add some festive cheer for our Meals on Wheels customers to let them know they're in our thoughts. These grants can go a long way to uplifting people's lives in simple ways."

Anyone whose cause could do with a cash boost is invited to approach their ward councillors and request support from the Better Neighbourhood Grants fund. Each councillor has £1,000 to spend in the financial year up to March 2018.

Surrey County Council elections 2017

Surrey County Council elections are being held on Thursday 4 May 2017. If you are not already registered to vote, visit www.gov.uk/register-to-vote before 13 April to make an application.

As well as being used for elections, the Electoral Register is also used by credit referencing agencies to check where people live when they apply for any form of credit such as a mortgage, loan or hire purchase agreement. Residents who are not on the Electoral Register may find it more difficult to obtain credit.

Polling stations will be open from 7am to 10pm on Thursday 4 May. If you are unable to get to the Polling Station you can apply for a postal vote. The deadline for new postal vote applications or cancelling existing arrangements is 5pm on 18 April. Alternatively you can appoint a proxy to vote on your behalf and the deadline for this is 25 April.

Improving Sunbury Cross

The underpass at Sunbury Cross has undergone a make-over thanks to work carried out by Spelthorne's Community Safety team and the Police and Crime Commissioner.

Prior to the improvements being made, students from Sunbury Manor were asked to complete a survey which asked for their views on the underpass and any concerns they may have about using it. The results provided lots of useful information which helped the Council and its partners decide what should be improved.

With help from the Probation Service's Community Payback team, the underpass was first given a deep clean to address concerns the children had raised about the appearance of the area. The signs in and around the underpass, around 30 in total, were replaced, as many were in poor condition and several sections of wooden fencing were also repaired.

Community emergency plans

Spelthorne Council, in partnership with the Environment Agency and Surrey County Council, is helping communities to write their own emergency plans for events such as flooding, severe weather and other emergency situations. So far the Council has worked with more than 15 groups across Staines, Laleham, Shepperton and Lower Sunbury. Most of the groups start by writing a flood plan which can then be used as the basis for other emergency situations. The plans focus on:-

- understanding the risks and trigger points for the area
- enabling individuals to take steps to make homes and communities more resilient
- identifying and utilising skills and resources within the community
- providing lead contacts for both the community and the responding agencies

Don't get fined for fly-tipping

If you arrange for someone to dispose of your waste you are obliged to check that the person or company you use holds a permit from the Environment Agency. If your waste is found fly-tipped and is tracked back to you, you may receive a £400 fixed penalty notice or be prosecuted. The Magistrates Court can impose fines of up to £5000 and the Crown Court has powers to issue unlimited fines and even imprison offenders.

Here are some tips:

- ensure that any person who takes your waste is licensed - check the register at www.gov.uk/access-the-public-register-for-environmental-information
- ask the waste carrier to provide you with their full address and telephone number
- ask to see the waste carrier's licence and take a photo of it
- ensure that the waste carrier provides you with a waste transfer notice
- if you are using a builder, ensure it is clear in your contract who is responsible for removing the waste

The Council actively pursues fly-tippers and recently prosecuted a man from Staines-upon-Thames who dumped building waste he had been paid to take away. He received a suspended prison sentence and was ordered to carry out 200 hours of unpaid community work.
