We also had some prestigious visitors from our twin district of Grand Port, Mauritius. I was delighted when he agreed in principle for street lights in Spelthorne to be switched back on as long as the County, who has responsibility for street lighting, were reimbursed the cost. The County Council has now voted to allow boroughs to pay for street lights to be switched back on and I am pleased to report this has now happened in Spelthorne.

Budget pressures will continue to present challenges for Spelthorne and our colleagues at Surrey County Council over the coming months but please be assured that we will always work hard to protect the services you value most.

Finally, I would like to pay tribute to Spelthorne's Chief Executive, Roberto Tambini, who is retiring in September after 37 years in local government, the last 11 years in Spelthorne. He has been very generous with his support, wisdom and friendship during my time in office and those of you who have met him will know that he is a man of enormous charm and integrity. He will be a hard act to follow. We wish him and his wife, Anne, a long and happy retirement.

## **Message from the Mayor of Spelthorne**

When I was elected in May as Mayor of Spelthorne I said that I wanted to involve and celebrate the talents of people across all ages and interests by supporting local events and meeting as many residents as possible. Since becoming Mayor I have been invited to a variety of events. New to Spelthorne were the appointment of a Mayor's Cadet by Staines and Egham Sea Cadets at their Royal Naval Parade, and a Spelthorne and Runnymede Joint Volunteer Awards evening, a wonderful celebration of all those who make life better by helping others. Surrey Youth Games gave 4,500 young people training in their choice of fifteen sports, ending in a weekend competition in which Team Spelthorne came third in the County. I joined the Lord Lieutenant of Surrey to open Shepperton Village Fair, awarding prizes for the Fancy Dress Parade and judging the Raft Race. It was great fun.

The River Thames has been very significant in my life and important for Spelthorne with its nine mile stretch and I planned to celebrate this. My first mayoral and charity event was therefore a River Day on Saturday 24 June. Having arranged the Borough's Magna Carta flotilla in 2015 I was delighted to secure the honour of being permitted to use Gloriana, the prestigious rowbarge built for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee. The flotilla also included Impossible Dream, adapted for wheelchairs – one of my charities – and Jolly Brit, former tender to the Royal Yacht Britannia, as well as a variety of boats from local skiff and rowing clubs. The crowds at the locks and along the towpath made this an unforgettable event.

Thanks to the support of the businesses in Staines-upon-Thames, we were able to keep Gloriana for Staines-upon-Thames Day on Sunday 25 June, a main attraction not only when moored at Memorial Gardens but also for row-pasts in the afternoon.

## **Hassle free letting for landlords**

Spelthorne Rent Assure is a scheme available for private landlords who are interested in renting their property through the Council. The scheme is one of the most attractive currently on offer for landlords.

Under the scheme, the Council guarantees to pay landlords directly the full market rent for their property for up to two years. A free inventory check will be carried out at the beginning of the tenancy and there is the reassurance of a six-week repair bond. The Council will find the tenants and, when approved by the landlord, will draw up the agreements free of charge. Ongoing support for both the landlord and the tenant is available for the duration of the tenancy.

Gareth Lewis from Sunbury-on-Thames has been a local landlord for 22 years and was one of the first to join the scheme. Gareth said: "Sian and her daughter are a pleasure to have as tenants.

For me the Spelthorne Rent Assure scheme has been a real success and I've been very reassured by the support offered by the Council's Housing Options team."

## **Recycling changes: new 3 in 1 service**

On 12 June we launched our 3 in 1 service collecting your unwanted textiles and small electricals weekly at the same time as your food waste. Look out for our new vehicles driving around the Borough.

Textiles in any condition that are clean and dry will be collected (rips are fine but nothing soiled please). You can include accessories (scarves, gloves, hats, belts and bags), bed linen, clothes, curtains, towels, paired shoes/boots and slippers. All items should be bagged.

80% of the textiles collected are reused and those that cannot be reused are recycled into items like insulation. Reusing and recycling saves the Council (and taxpayers) money. Please do not include carpets, rugs, duvets, pillows, single shoes or soiled materials.

We collect small electrical items such as toasters, kettles, irons, hairdryers, clocks, phones and cameras. They are broken down into their various components and recycled. Please do not mix textiles and electricals in the same bag. Tie bags securely and put next to your food waste bin by 6am on your collection day. Remember that food waste, textiles and electricals are collected on the same day as your rubbish/recycling, but at a different time of day.

If you need a food waste caddy or clear plastic bags for textiles and small electricals you can collect these for free from the Council Offices or Community Centres. If your property does not currently have food waste collections and you would like us to introduce the service, please contact us.

Spelthorne's Enforcement Team tackle a range of problems linked to anti-social behaviour including fly-tipping, dog fouling, graffiti, littering and abandoned vehicles. In the last nine months the team has taken action on a large range of issues:

- prosecuted five instances of fly tipping resulting in fines, community service and suspended prison sentences for the offenders
- issued 20 community protection warnings (for persistent unreasonable behaviour)

- removed eight traveller incursions
- dealt with four prosecutions for persistent mooring offences

When fly-tipping appears it creates great concern for residents so Spelthorne Council is pleased to have recently obtained new powers to tackle fly-tipping and abandoned vehicles which allows staff to issue Fixed Penalty Fines of £400.

The Enforcement Team has also been reminding residents that they can help tackle fly-tipping by checking the credentials of anyone offering to dispose of their waste. ## **Don't wash raw chicken**

Campylobacter is the most common cause of food poisoning in the UK. You can't see it, smell it or even taste it on food, but if it affects you, you won't forget it. There are simple things you can do to stay safe:

- cover raw chicken and store it at the bottom of the fridge so it can't drip onto other foods
- don't wash it - washing chicken spreads germs around your sink and taps; cooking it properly will make it safe
- thoroughly wash all utensils, chopping boards and surfaces with hot soapy water and then rinse in clean water or use a dishwasher. Wash your hands thoroughly too
- make sure the chicken is steaming hot all the way through, with no pink meat and the juices run clear
- when barbequing make sure you don't use the same tongs or dishes for raw meat and cooked food

**Creating a buzz**

Spelthorne Council has been making improvements to the Borough's parks in a bid to improve the environment for pollinating insects.

Pollinating insects include honey bees, bumblebees, solitary bees, wasps, hoverflies, butterflies, moths and beetles. Since the 1950s, the number and variety of pollinators has been in decline, with many species disappearing from large parts of the country.

Staff and volunteers in Spelthorne have been working to create pollinator-friendly areas by planting 450m of hedgerows, 320m<sup>2</sup> of wildflowers, 3000 bulbs and 750m of wildflower margins to help reverse the decline in these important insects. More work is planned.
